

## **CME Associates Please NOTE:**

The following change by the American Medical Association goes into effect on **July 1, 2011** and is mandatory every time the credit designation statement is used:

### **AMA Credit Designation Statement**

The AMA Credit Designation Statement indicates to physicians that the activity has been certified by an accredited CME provider as being in compliance with *AMA PRA Category 1 Credit™* requirements. The AMA Credit Designation Statement must be written without paraphrasing and be listed separately from accreditation or other statements.

The following AMA Credit Designation Statement must be included in relevant announcement and activity materials (see page 8):

The UAMS College of Medicine designates this [learning format] for a maximum of [number of credits] *AMA PRA Category 1 Credit(s)™*. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

The learning format listed in the Credit Designation Statement must be one of the following AMA approved learning formats:

- 1. Live activity – this includes all Regularly Scheduled Series (RSS), conferences, symposiums, webinars, etc. that are offered live. For example:**

The UAMS College of Medicine designates this live activity for a maximum of 1.0 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credit(s)™*. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

- 2. Enduring material For example:**

The UAMS College of Medicine designates this enduring material for a maximum of 1.0 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credit(s)™*. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.
