Stephen Bogdewic, Ph.D., is the Executive Associate Dean for Faculty Affairs and Professional Development and the George W. Copeland Professor and Associate Chair of Family Medicine at Indiana University School of Medicine. He also holds appointments in Medicine, Pediatrics and Public and Environmental Affairs. Bogdewic is past president of the Indiana University School of Medicine faculty, and is also one of the co-hosts of Sound Medicine, a weekly public radio program sponsored by the Indiana University School of Medicine and WFYI Public Radio. Bogdewic is a nationally recognized lecturer, consultant and educator. He is also a licensed therapist and maintains an active clinical practice. His scholarly interests include professional development, leadership development, clinical teaching skills and the quality improvement of health care.

Larry Cornett, Ph.D., Professor, Department of Physiology and Biophysics and Executive Associate Dean for Research in the College of Medicine and the Vice Chancellor for Research for UAMS, joined the UAMS faculty in 1980. Cornett is the Director of the Arkansas INBRE, a program funded by the NIH to develop biomedical research infrastructure in the state. Among his many honors, Cornett has received a fellowship from the NIH Fogarty Center and a Research Career Enhancement Award from the American Physiological Society.

David Dubriske, M.S., provides support for Blackboard and Wimba course creation, implementation and assessment at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Before joining OED, Dubriske was an Assistant Professor of Mathematics where he developed and implemented several on-line courses. He has more than 15 years experience teaching mathematics and

economics and has been a leader in assessing student learning to improve curriculum and create a learning environment that benefits both student and teacher. Dubriske has presented his work using technology to enhance student learning at regional and international conferences. He earned his Master's of Science degree in Mathematics from the University of Arkansas Fayetteville and his Master's of Science degree in Economics from the University of North Carolina – Chapel Hill.

Keith Freeman provides support to UAMS faculty in the use of online educational technology. He is a Wimba Certified Trainer and brings with him a background in training support, multimedia design, corporate communications, web, video production and graphic design. Freeman graduated with a degree in Journalism from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. He has won several awards for his productions in the corporate and health field and is proficient with several software applications.

Curtis L. Lowery, M.D., Professor and Chairman, Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, UAMS College of Medicine, was the lead investigator on the Clinical and Translational Science Award (CTSA) from the National Center for Research Resources of the NIH. It is a highly sought-after grant among institutions that aims to translate basic science discoveries into speedier treatments and cures for patients. Lowery is viewed as a champion of antenatal and neonatal telemedicine benefiting the patient and physician alike. Lowery has served as the Director of Obstetrics at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences since 1992. In that time, he facilitated the process in which Arkansas insurance handles telemedicine, increased Medicaid reimbursements

and promoted understanding for telemedicine, and brought telehealth access to more than 60 hospitals and community clinics in rural Arkansas providing medical consultations combined with provider and patient education. Lowery has established a Medicaid-funded, cost-effective programmatic solution to assist Arkansas' high-risk pregnancies, ANGELS.

Debra Miller, M.L.S., is the Liaison & Education Librarian at the UAMS Library, Reference Services Department and the Coordinator of the Library Liaison Program which was established to foster partnerships between the Library and the research, educational, clinical and outreach programs at UAMS. This program offers services such as updates on new resources and databases, advanced literature searching by expert searchers, consultations and specialized search strategy development, and library orientations/tours/presentations/training. Miller is also involved with education, instruction and outreach activities throughout the UAMS campus.

Michelle Phillips, M.A., has been with UAMS' Organizational Development department since September 2008. She conducts trainings in leadership development, team building, organizational change, effective communication, generational diversity, conflict transformation, and emotional and social intelligence. She has a master's degree in Interpersonal and Organizational Communication from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. Phillips is a certified mediator through the Arkansas Circuit Court's Alternative Dispute Resolution Commission; a certified Birkman consultant; and an adjunct instructor for UALR and Pulaski Technical College.

Jennifer Sharp, J.D., has been the UAMS Research Compliance Officer since 2006. Sharp manages internal research auditing programs of human research studies and IRB operations. She developed the campus Research Compliance Plan and has served as a policy and regulatory resource during weekly IRB and IACUC meetings and as a resource for accreditation activities and policy and procedure review.

Jeannette M. Shorey II, M.D., Associate Professor, Department of Medicine, is the Associate Dean for CME and Faculty Affairs, UAMS College of Medicine. Shorey is an internist and clinician-educator whose career focus is now the professional health and vitality of the faculty at the College of Medicine at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Her academic career has previously focused on studying and teaching strategies to help physicians communicate effectively with their patients and colleagues, and on designing and delivering graduate medical education programs that truly prepare young physicians to deliver quality patient care. She is a long-time member of the American Academy on Communication in Healthcare, where she plays a major role in its faculty development programs, and has served both as its Vice President and a member of its Board of Directors.

Connie Wilson, M.L.S., is a Reference Librarian at the UAMS Library after serving as the Fayetteville AHEC Librarian for 30 years. Wilson does general reference work with students, staff and faculty and handles the computers used by the public.
