General Information:

Course Location/Facilities: UAMS – IDW Building – Room 126 - Little Rock, AR (We will have out signs to help direct you.)

From I-630 take exit 3B turning north on to Cedar/Pine, take Pine street north to Markham, at traffic light turn west on to Markham at second traffic light turn south on to Hooper Drive. Parking is free on the weekends in the employee parking lot that is on the left and runs parallel with Markham. Take Hooper Drive traffic and take the round-about and circle back towards Markham, the entrance to the employee parking lot is on your right. The IDW building is located on the right when you turn on to Hooper Drive. You will enter through the COPH building and go to the first floor, take the sky bridge across the street (it crosses Hooper Drive).

Directions to the IDW Building:

1. Follow the red path to the Employee parking lot. You can park on the parking deck but you must pay to park there.
2. Walk up the stairs and enter the College of Public Health Building to your right.
3. Take elevator to the first floor.
4. You will see a Boulevard Bread Company when you exit the elevators to your right, take the sky bridge next to the Boulevard Bread.
5. The IDW (I.Dodd Wilson Building or Wilson Education Building) is on your right across the sky bridge. We will be in room 126.
